14. No photography of slides is allowed at the ASA meeting. Consent of speakers must be obtained beforehand. The rule has not quite been followed, and this policy something that can be emphasized in the future.

15. The meetings committee is looking into how to better utilize room space, which would reduce talks.

- Audio-video (A/V) costs are high.
- It is proposed that talks requiring A/V be concentrated in the middle of the week. A few other options were discussed. See slides for details.
- Lots of students give talks in our meeting, which is time-consuming and increases costs, but student participation in this capacity is also a unique feature of the Society.
- An attendee did not want for the time slots of talks to be reduced, because this reduces the quality of the content/the depth of what can be conveyed.
- Kevin brought up the possibility of reducing to just one meeting per year. This was very controversial, but it seemed that a significant portion (more than half) of attendees wanted to reduce the frequency of ASA meetings to just a single meeting per year.
- There were some positive thoughts on reducing the A/V (lecture-based) content to be condensed to fewer days.
- Attendees generally want to support students. There were negative feelings about having students exclusively present posters, because a great benefit of the Society is the opportunity for students to present lectures.
- A three-day meeting was proposed, which might be more family-friendly.

16. Virtual meeting

- The virtual meeting schedule was presented. It was verified that the meeting will be in November, but the dates presented were slightly incorrect. See slides and check the ASA website for all the details.
- The fee will be \$250 for member registration. There will be a \$25 watch party supplement running on an honor system. There are some travel funds which might be used to diffused some costs.
